





City of Orillia Building Activity




City of Orillia Building Activity continued



5 Year average of 192 units per year




2008 until end of March building activity




Statistical Profile - Labour





- Orillia University Mayors Task Force formed in Fall of 2004
- January 18, 2005 Council announced the "Partnership in Principal" with Lakehead University to establish a satellite campus in Orillia
- March 23, 2005 over 160 people cram into Council Chambers to hear a presentation by Dr. Fred Gilbert, President of Lakehead University



- In April, Lakehead announced the formation of the Orillia Campus Implementation Task Force comprised of 22 Lakehead representatives and 14 from Orillia
- They also created 5 working groups – Academic Planning, Academic Needs, Student Life and Services, Facilities and Human Resources
- In total a further 27 members from Orillia volunteered to sit on the working groups



- In late August the Implementation Task Force compiled all of the reports from the working groups to prepared the Business and Academic Plan
- In October Lakehead University announced that the Board of Governors had unanimously passed the ‘Plan’ an officially announced that Lakehead Orillia is a go for the Fall of 2006
- In early December Lakehead Senate officially ratifying the academic plan for the Orillia Campus



City of Orillia Investment

- Total commitment is for 10 million to be invested in the permanent campus location
- 85 acres of serviced land in West Orillia (valued at 5 million)
- 5 million dollar capital investment over 10 years (\$500,000 annually) beginning in 2010

What made Lakehead attractive to the City of Orillia

- Most of the other universities satellite campuses are single facility scenarios
- Lakehead is planning a comprehensive satellite campus for Orillia
- Ultimate goal is over 5,000 students
- Employ over 700 people

- Total average estimated impact on the City of Brantford annually between 2005 – 2010 to be 20 to 27 million annually
